PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCES

Before winning the competition as Chief Music Librarian, I have been Opera Stage Prompter freelance in Italy for 4 years.

As Chief Librarian of Teatro San Carlo di Napoli I worked with/for many important conductors preparing for them a huge amount of orchestral materials for Opera, Ballet, Symphonic Concerts for 29 seasons.

I joined some tournée abroad with orchestra of Teatro San Carlo: in Paris, Erl, Tokyo, Monterey, Otsu, Lyon, San Francisco, Hong Kong, Milan, Moskow, Saint Petersburg, Santiago, Muscat, Dubai, Bangkok, Montreal, Prague.

In September 2009 in L'Aquila I worked closely with M^o Riccardo Muti as his librarian and assistant conductor for the concert he led dedicated to the survivors of the earthquake.

In October 2013 Maestro Nicola Luisotti (Music Director at San Francisco Opera) entrusted me the work to prepare the musical material and orchestra divisions, for the great event of Verdi's Requiem played with Orchestra and Choir of San Francisco Opera and Teatro San Carlo, at the War Memorial Opera House in San Francisco.

I chaired the examination committee for the competitions of Head Music Librarian for the opera houses Teatro Petruzzelli Bari, Teatro Regio Torino, Teatro Massimo Palermo and the Teatro Lirico Cagliari and Arena di Verona.
